

Matthew 24 – 25 Part 2

“Seventy weeks are determined for your people and for your holy city, to finish the transgression, to make an end of sins, to make reconciliation for iniquity, to seal up vision and prophecy, and to anoint the Most Holy.

Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the command to restore and build Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince, there shall be seven weeks again, and the wall, even in troublesome times.

And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; and the people of the prince who is to come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end of it shall be with a flood, and till the end of the war desolations are determined.

Then he shall confirm a covenant with many for one week; but in the middle of the week, He shall bring an end to sacrifice and offering. And on the wing of abominations shall be one who makes desolate, even until the consummation, which is determined, is poured out on the desolate.” (Daniel 9:24-27)

1. Daniel 9:25-26
 - a. Seven weeks (49 years) - to rebuild the city and temple.
 - b. Sixty-Two weeks (434 years) – Israel’s golden years.
 - c. The end of the sixty-ninth week (483 years) – Messiah is “cut off,” the cross.
2. There is a gap between verses 26 and 27
 - a. Verse 26 – *“And after the sixty-two weeks...”*
 - b. Messiah is *cut off*, crucified.
 - c. Jerusalem is destroyed by people (Romans) of the prince to come (Deuteronomy 28:49-50, 52, 64).
3. Verse 27 – One week (seven years) – The Antichrist and the Tribulation.

The Sixty-Ninth Week

1. The sixty-ninth week ended with Jesus going to the cross.
2. This was prophesied in the Old Testament:
 - a. Psalm 22
 - b. Isaiah 53
3. Church Age, Grace Age, the Mystery has been inserted between Daniel’s 69th and 70th week.

Daniel’s Seventieth Week

1. Daniel 9:27
 - a. The Tribulation is the END of the Jewish Age.
 - b. The Tribulation is seven years (one week) in length.
 - c. The Antichrist (prince) will make a covenant with Israel for seven years.
 - d. He will reveal himself in fury in the middle of the week until the end, or three and a half years.
2. Daniel had a vision of the Tribulation (Daniel 7:24-27).
