

## **Understanding the Godhead**

## *"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."* (2 Corinthians 13:14)

- 1. This is the New Testament doctrine of the Trinity being used in our prayers for the saints.
- 2. Old Testament prayers were made up of Old Testament doctrine (Numbers 6:23-26).

## The Trinity

- 1. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
  - a. God-Elohim
  - b. Jehovah Yahweh- Lord
- 2. The trinity is presented in Old Testament. It is taught and explained in the New Testament.
- 3. God is seen as one in essence in the Old Testament (Deuteronomy 6:4).
- 4. God is taught as more persons than one in the Old Testament (Genesis 1:2).
- 5. The three members of the Godhead are seen in the Old Testament (Isaiah 48:16).
- 6. How can they be three and yet one?
  - a. "Team" is one word consisting of many.
  - b. Scriptural examples:
    - 1. 2 Chronicles 5:13
    - 2. Judges 20:1
    - 3. Acts 2:1
    - 4. Ephesians 5:31-32
- 7. God is three in persons and one in vision, goals, purpose.
  - a. God the Father creates the plan (creation, redemption).
  - b. Jesus, the Son, executes the plan (made all things, was crucified).
  - c. Holy Spirit reveals the plan (through the word and into the heart).
- 8. All three members are one in attributes.
  - a. Sovereignty
  - b. Righteousness
  - c. Justice
  - d. Love
  - e. Eternal life
  - f. Omniscience
  - g. Omnipresence

- h. Omnipotence
- i. Immutability
- j. Truthfulness
- 9. "The Lord is my light and my salvation..." (Psalm 27:1).
  - a. Light is white made of three primary colors, red, yellow, and blue.
  - b. Salvation is three-fold past, present, future, spirit, soul, and body.
- 10. New Testament references to the trinity:

  - b. Romans 1:20
  - c. Colossians 2:9
  - d. Matthew 3:16-17
  - e. Matthew 28:19

- 11. Jesus is the manifested member of the Godhead (Colossians 1:15, John 1:1).
  - a. God is invisible
  - b. Jesus is visible
  - c. The Holy Spirit is invisible
  - d. Words are a tangible expression of invisible thoughts
  - e. Thoughts are formed (Father)
  - f. Words are spoken (Jesus)
  - g. Comprehension takes place (The Holy Spirit)

## The Ministries of the Godhead

*"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."* (2 Corinthians 13:14)

- 1. Jesus brought the grace of God to us (2 Corinthians 8:9, 2 Corinthians 12:9).
- 2. The love of God comes from the God of love. God is love.
- 3. The Holy Spirit is our partner or companion. He does not speak of Himself, but Jesus Christ and the Father.
