

Why Man?

"For You have made him a little lower than the angels, and You have crowned him with glory and honor.

You have made him to have dominion over the works of Your hands; you have put all things under his feet, all sheep and oxen—even the beasts of the field..." (Psalm 8:5-7)

Understanding the Angelic Conflict

- 1. Satan was created first as Lucifer, the anointed cherub who ruled directly under God and over all other angels.
- 2. Satan tried to overtake God's throne.
- 3. He failed but continued to challenge God.
- 4. Satan coerced and took one third of the angels with him.
- 5. God told Satan and the fallen angels He would one day prove He was right and one day say, "I told you so."
- 6. God judged and destroyed all earth's life and systems leaving only Satan and demons.
- 7. God started over with Adam and Eve.
- 8. Man is the pawn between God and Satan.
 - a. An inferior creature to angels in wisdom, knowledge, and strength (Psalm 8).
 - b. Man was given choice the same as the angels were.
 - c. Each time man chooses God it is another nail in Satan's coffin.
- 9. Man is here to settle the angelic conflict as the ultimate decider that God was right and Satan wrong.
- 10. Neither God nor Satan can coerce a person to accept or reject Jesus. They can influence but not force or decide for man.
- 11. Man's will is the issue:
 - a. God, in sovereignty, cannot choose for man.
 - b. Satan is not sovereign but also cannot force choices.
- 12. "By which (the resurrection) also He went and preached (made a proclamation) to the spirits in prison (Tartarus)..." (1 Peter 3:19)

At His resurrection, Jesus visited the fallen angels in Tartarus to say, "I told you so."
